



COVID-19 Updates

We look forward to welcoming you to Frangipani and to the island of Anguilla, but we realize this is such an uncertain time and that the situation around COVID-19 is evolving faster than most of us can wrap our minds around. Our goal is to continue to share the most recent information that's available to us to help with your travel plans and decision making. Please also understand that we often times receive information at the same time it's seen by the public, which means that we are adapting accordingly and doing our best to be as thoughtful and careful as we can as we navigate this unprecedented time. Please continue reading for information on logistics related to coming to Anguilla:

March 19, 2020: Effective March 21st, Anguilla will shut down all borders (air and sea) to all inbound AND outbound transit. The last possible departures are on Friday, March 20th. Borders are closed for two weeks. In line with this, **Frangipani Beach Resort will be closed until April 4, 2020** and will continue to re-evaluate during this time. We will be in touch with all guests personally about options. At this time, public health is the island's number one priority and we are supporting them in this goal.

March 17, 2020: In addition, it was announced today that the **public ferries transiting from Marigot, St. Martin to Anguilla** will run their final service this evening at 7:00PM, to be resumed at a later date that is yet to be determined.

March 15, 2020: St. Maarten shared a press release stating that **all flights from the USA and Europe into St. Maarten are banned for two weeks**, effective March 17th. At the moment, Anguilla's Clayton J. Lloyd (AXA) airport is still functioning as usual, with incoming direct flights from Puerto Rico and neighboring islands.

Our recent meetings with the Ministry of Health have been positive. The island is operating as usual at this time, with restaurants and activities still open. To date, Anguilla hasn't had any cases of Coronavirus and there are some fairly strict measures in place to prevent the virus from reaching the island. Especially in light of our rather small hospital facilities, public health is the number one priority for all of us. Any visitors to the island who have visited any region in the world (except the Caribbean) are subject to a 14 day quarantine upon arrival into the island to prevent potential viral spread.

We recognize that this situation is evolving rapidly and we're trying to adjust and adapt accordingly. There is a meeting taking place in Anguilla today regarding further policy decisions which we hope to continue to share as changes are made.
